~ LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY DIVISION ~ RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1) All Exhibitors must pay a \$5.00 Membership fee to Region of Peel Agricultural Society. Livestock Exhibitors should enter at the livestock gate and complimentary admission will be given based on the aforementioned livestock pass policy.
- 2) All entries must be made on the forms of the Society supplied by the secretary free of charge.
- 3) Except where stated, all entries must be made by the bona-fide owner of the exhibit.
- 4) All grains, fruits, roots and vegetables entered *MUST* be actually raised by the exhibitor and the growth of 2021 or 2022 unless otherwise specified. The correct name must be put on every article exhibited.
- 5) No exhibitor shall compete for more than one prize in each class, unless otherwise specified.
- 6) In all departments, unless otherwise specified herein, classes are open to Ontario.
- 7) All entry and prize tickets must remain on articles and animals while on exhibition. No ticket, medal or other award of any former exhibition or name of exhibitor, or any mark by which the owner of the exhibit can be known will be allowed on the animal or articles until the judges have completed their awards.
- 8) Animals not ready for judging at the proper time will forfeit rights of competition.
- 9) All protests against the decision of the judges or against an exhibit must be made and declared to the secretary within 24 hours, stating the cause of protest, and must be signed by the complainant and accompanied by one hundred dollars (\$100.00) which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest is not sustained. All protests will be referred to the respective committee, which have full powers to investigate the same and report to the Board of Directors for approval which, if confirmed by them, shall be final, and the protest with the report thereon shall be entered in a book kept for the purpose.
- 10) While the officers and directors of the Region of Peel Agricultural Society will take every reasonable precaution to insure the safety of animals and articles exhibited it is understood that the exhibitors shall release the Region of Peel Agricultural Society, its officers and directors from all claims for damages arising from loss or destruction of or injury to exhibits of property at Brampton Fair or injury or damage to any attendant or other persons in charge of said exhibits or any property of such, whether occasioned by negligence or otherwise, and the exhibitors agree to indemnify the Region of Peel Agricultural Society against all claims or demands of any kind by any animal or other exhibit arising from negligence or misconduct of any person in charge of such exhibit or by reason of injury or damage to any such attendant or person in charge of the property of such. The directors will take every precaution to prevent accidents but will not hold themselves responsible for any accident on the fairgrounds.

- 11) Tents or booths for the sale of intoxicating liquors, all kinds of gambling or mountebank performances are prohibited.
- 12) **JUDGE'S NOTE** – In the absence of competition in any section or if the entry be of inferior quality, judges must award only such prizes as they deem the entry worth.
- 13) No exhibitor shall be allowed to be present while the judges are discharging duties. Any person who shall attempt to interfere with the judges, directors or officers of the Society, or who shall on the premises use any contemptuous or abusive language to any judge, directors or officer shall forfeit his right to any premiums to which he may be entitled, and shall be excluded from exhibiting for one year thereafter. Judges or officers are particularly requested to immediately report any breach of this rule. All disqualification in this and the next following rules may be published with their awards.
- 14) Upon the discovery of any fraud, deception or dishonest practice, either in the preparation of ownership, or any fraudulent representation concerning any article exhibited, the director shall have the power to withhold the payment of any or all premiums awarded to the exhibitor proven to be guilty of such offense.
- 15) Any member or exhibitor giving or lending his ticket to any person for the purpose of getting on the grounds without paying entrance fee, or for the purpose of imposing on the Society in any way, will deprive him of all rights to which he would be entitled and forfeit any premium which may be awarded him.
- 16) Grounds and buildings will be open to receive exhibits as stated in sections, and they must be on the grounds and in proper exhibit halls ready for judging by times stated. Exhibits must remain there until time specified for their removal.
- 17) If due to inclement weather or for any other reason, receipts prove insufficient to meet all expenses, the directors reserve the right to deduct a percentage from all prize monies.
- 18) Specials & prizes are subject to change without notice. If additional specials or prizes become available they will be awarded at the fair.
- 19) Payments must accompany all entries by mail. Entry and exhibition tickets will be retained at secretary's office until called for. No trading of entry tickets will be allowed after entering the grounds and buildings.
- 20) Five dollars will be retained on all prizes of \$10.00 and upwards for membership ticket for 2023. ALL CHEQUES, GOODS AND PRIZES MUST BE CASHED BY NOVEMBER 30, 2022.
- 21) All livestock must remain on the grounds until judging is completed on all classes or forfeit money.
- 22) No livestock will be allowed in the livestock buildings before 9:00 a.m. Thursday, September 15th, 2022.
- 23) The officers and directors of the Region of Peel Agricultural Society reserve the right to refuse admittance to any person or persons to the fairgrounds, on any fair day, for reasons that the officers and directors may deem justifiable.
- 24) **ERRORS** – The Society will not hold itself responsible for any printer's error or other palpable errors in this prize list.

- 25) All exhibitors MUST have their own insurance and should be prepared to show proof when asked. Every exhibitor must sign a Hold Harmless Agreement.
- 26) **Directors reserve the right to substitute goods in place of cash prizes in any class.**

2022 SPORTPONY STARESEARCH QUALIFIER

This division is open to any pony meeting the sportpony criteria. i.e. hunter, jumper, driving, eventing, etc. The first place in each of the six (6) in hand classes at the qualifying shows are eligible to enter to qualify for the **SPORTPONY STARESEARCH CHALLENGE CUP**, held at the Royal Winter Fair in November 2022. Both under saddle classes also qualify for each respective class. Ponies **MUST** measure 14.2 hands or under. Passport and registration are not necessary to participate. General EC rules for sporthorses will apply.

Adults CAN ride a pony. Stallions may NOT be handled or ridden by children at the Royal Winter Fair, but may be at the qualifying shows discretion. **At Brampton Fair Juniors may NOT show stallions.**

If the first place pony has already qualified at a previous show in 2022 then the second place pony becomes the qualifier. Once qualified a pony may still show at any of the qualifying shows. A list of shows can be viewed at www.royalfair.org.

At the Royal the SPORTPONY STARSEARCH winner will be awarded the perpetual MORTON SPORTPONY CHALLENGE CUP and a silver keeper plate. Our sponsors, DENWORTH EQUINE MANAGEMENT - Sherri Whitworth-Denouden and Jeremy Denouden, award each qualifier with a ribbon throughout the year & \$1000.00 in prize money to the Starsearch Champion Class at the 2022 Royal Winter Fair.

DAIRY, BEEF AND SHEEP

Livestock Classifications – Rules & Regulations

1. The Region of Peel Agricultural Society has again adopted the classifications as suggested by the Canada Department of Agriculture and the following rules concerning this classification apply.
2. Health-all animals shown must be in healthy condition, free of all diseases. Veterinarians of the Health of Animals Division Canada Department of Agriculture make checks from time to time to see that this rule is enforced. Ontario has Brucellosis-free status now. Agriculture Canada informs us of the following regulation change: Certificate of Health (form 4's) are not necessary for animals going to shows in Ontario. All animals from out of province must have certificate of health.

NOTE: NO ANIMALS WILL BE ALLOWED OFF TRUCKS WITHOUT APPROPRIATE HEALTH CERTIFICATES.

- 3 Registration certificates must accompany each animal so that they may be checked as the animal enters the ring and all cattle must be property of the exhibitor.
 4. a) For the purposes of the Classification as an exhibit shall be interpreted as follows: All purebred registered animals, whether owned by one person or by more than one person (individually or jointly) which are maintained on one farm or breeding unit, are considered to be the production of that farm or breeding unit. An exhibit is a unit of livestock qualifying for an entry into a class as specified in the classifications. Classes J and K in the Beef Cattle Section are considered to be one exhibit for definition purposes.
 4. b) For the purposes of the Classifications a breeding unit is defined as follows: In each classification where the same or common interests are involved in more than one breeding operation such operations are considered as one breeding unit. In all cases where there is any doubt that more than one breeding unit exists, the interpretation shall be that only one breeding unit exists. The responsibility of proof of separation of breeding units shall rest with the exhibitor(s).
 5. Checking of exhibits is the responsibility of the fair or exhibition adopting the Classifications. The fair must exclude ineligible animals and those not positively identified before judging.
- All animals should be on grounds by 10:00 a.m. unless otherwise stated. Sections will be judged in the order they appear in the prize list. All applicable general rules of Brampton Fair shall apply.
- Entry fee** of 20% will be deducted from prize money unless otherwise indicated.

Rules and Regulations

1. All general rules of the Region of Peel Agricultural Society apply and all exhibitors must be members of the Region of Peel Agricultural Society. (\$5.00)
2. All animals should be on the grounds by 9:00 a.m. and must remain until 4:00 p.m. but all cattle must be out of the barn by 6:00 p.m. on the day of the show.
3. All exhibits must be owned and registered in the name of the exhibitor with **Canadian Angus** Registration. Note exceptions in the Get of Sire and Breeder's Herd Classes. **ENTRIES WITH REGISTRATIONS PENDING WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**
4. **All animals must be legibly tattooed. Tattoos will be checked.** If a tattoo is illegible or does not correspond to the tattoo number on the Certificate of Registration, the animal is not eligible to show and must be removed from the barn. **No exceptions – this rule will be adhered to.**
5. An exhibitor is not required to list the names and number of animals comprising a herd or group at the time of making entry, but must give such information to the designated official of the Central Ontario Angus Club concerned with the checking of registration certificates before the commencement of the judging of the herd group.
6. A bull over one year of age, without a ring in his nose, may be barred from showing.
7. **Tampering With Cattle:** Unethical fitting of cattle for competition is prohibited. All cattle entered for competition shall be presented in the judging ring in their natural conformation and with no preparation other than natural feeding and fitting, with the exception of any treatment of hair and hoofs. No additional hair or any other foreign substances will be allowed with the exception of switches.
8. In making entries, the owner's name and address in full, the exact age of the animal, its name, registration number, names of dam and sire, and name of breeder, must be given on the entry sheet. The birth date of the calf must be shown on the entry form and as well all **2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 & 2022** born entries must be tagged with "**Angus**" **RFID tag.**
9. An animal owned jointly by more than one individual, firm or corporation, must be registered in the name of such owners jointly, and when shown in a single section must be entered in the name of the registered joint owner; but such an animal must form part of a herd exhibited by any one of the registered joint owners. Any of the joint owners may use the animal if eligible in a group entry.

10. Only animals winning first or second prizes are eligible to compete for championship prizes.
11. Animals will be judged at 12:30 p.m. on September 18th, 2022. Exhibitors will govern themselves by the schedule without further notice. Cattle not in place at stated time will not be judged.
12. **Administration** fee is \$10.00 per entry. Entries close September 2nd, 2022. Late entry fee is \$50.00 per animal. No charge for group classes but they must be listed on entry form. No refund of entry fee. Upon arrival at show exhibitors must check in with secretary to verify their entry.
